Celebrating 40 Years: 2024 Qantas Australian Tourism Awards Honour Winners in Adelaide

Questacon - the National Science and Technology Centre (CBR) was recognised as the winner of Major Tourist Attractions, while Darwin Festival (NT) claimed Gold in the Major Festivals & Events category.

For their first ever win, Spinifex Brewery Cable Beach (WA) took Gold in the New Tourism Business category. The Tourism Wineries, Distilleries and Breweries category saw Gold awarded to Seppeltsfield Barossa (SA).

Peppers Silo Hotel (TAS) triumphed in the 4-4.5 Star Deluxe Accommodation category, with Balloon Aloft Australia (NSW) securing Gold in Excellence in Accessible Tourism.

Senator the Hon Don Farrell, Minister for Trade and Tourism, said the Australian Tourism Awards are an important way to recognise the outstanding operators across Australia.
